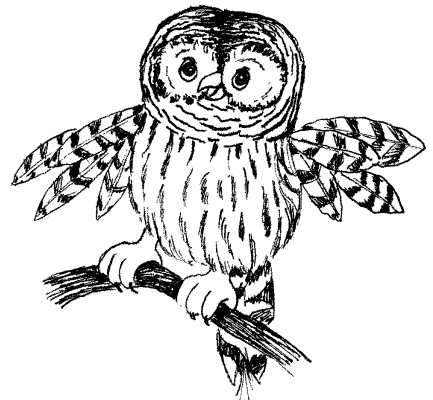

- Swamp Animals and Occupations Crossword Puzzle** 7-1
This activity will allow students to identify the definitions of the occupations and animals in the swamp.
- How Many Words Can You Make Out of These Occupations?** 7-3
This activity will allow students to spell new words from swamp occupations.
- National Park Service Career Word Scramble** 7-5
This activity will allow students to spell occupations correctly and talk about each occupation. Students could be given a list of occupations or they could write occupations on the board prior to this activity.
- Swamp Word Find** 7-7
This activity will allow students to find swamp occupations. It will reinforce the spelling of the occupations.
- Swamp Bingo**
- Game Cards** 7-9
- Flash Cards** 7-35
- Each student will have one swamp bingo card. The teacher can use creative animals, corn or pieces of paper for each student to place on their card. The teacher will read the description of an occupation and the student will find the occupation on their card. The student that gets Bingo first could be awarded a prize.
